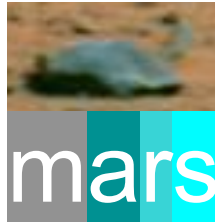

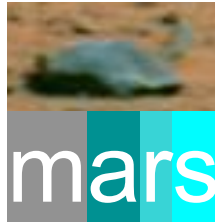
“The discovery of life on Mars may shed light on the origins of human life on Earth. We may find, for example, that men are from Mars and women are from Mars.”

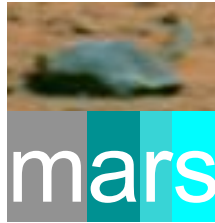

“Mars is a new world. We must think anew and act anew in regard to it. We must let the data go where it takes us, and not be misguided by mistaken pre-existing theories, suppositions, and dogmas. Science has become a religion in which all that is known and verified is presumed to be all that is knowable and verifiable. Yet the Universe holds more than we can ever imagine, and so there will be no end to the unraveling and redefinition of reality. If my discovery of life on Mars proves anything, it is that we must form our beliefs from our findings rather than form our findings from our beliefs.”

“Mars does not belong to us. It is not our planet to conquer and colonize. Mars belongs to the Martians, and if we don’t recognize and abide by that fact, we will fail our first major test of cosmic citizenship.”

“I have been asked many times what the Martians that my father and I encountered at Curtiss-Wright in 1970 looked like.
