- n. Existing research shows the COVID-19 pandemic and accompanying economic devastation are expected to have large-scale L' effects on overall mental health, including an increase in suicide.[1] In 2019, 2.5% of Canadians reported having had suicidal thoughts within the previous year. In comparison, in the thick of the pandemic in May, this survey found that 1 in 20 Canadians (6%) had recently experienced thoughts or feelings of suicide as a result of the pandemic, with a more glaring warning sign pointing to certain groups.

- o. “The pandemic is widening persistent mental health inequities and making things worse for those who were already vulnerable due to experiences of marginalization,” says lead

researcher Emily Jenkins, a professor of nursing at UBC who studies mental health and substance use. “When we strain all the parts of daily living—healthcare, childcare, schooling, job security—we see the direct, negative effects on people’s mental health.”

p. Family violence: In 2018, there were 60,651 child and youth victims (aged 17 and younger) of police-reported violence in Canada. Of these victims, 57% were female and 43% were male. Overall, child and youth victims of violence were most often victimized by a casual acquaintance (32%) or a family member (31%), while a stranger (17%) was relatively less common (Table 1.1). <https://www150.statcan.gc.ca/n1/pub/85-002-x/2019001/article/00018/01-eng.htm>

Family violence in Canada during the pandemic: The organization, which has roots in several GTA cities, Windsor and British Columbia, typically gets 200 calls on a weekly basis from women who are looking to get connected to resources.
